

# Transfer Student Guide: Pima Community College

## Rehabilitation Studies @ Services - Pre-PT Pathway ▶▶▶

### ADMISSIONS

In preparation for transferring to the University of Arizona as a rehabilitation studies and services major student, Pima Community College courses, which can be completed prior to transferring to the UA, are listed below. Often, these courses can be applied to the AGEC, which is best to complete prior to transferring. This sequence of courses is designed for students who intend on completing a bachelor's degree focusing on rehabilitation education, research, and service needs. The only program of its kind in the state of Arizona, the rehabilitation studies and services program offers students who plan on applying to graduate programs in physical therapy an opportunity to complete additional coursework to simultaneously meet requirements for entering a graduate program. Students should verify requirements of the intended graduate program, as they may vary.
